They have a variety of educational backgrounds and many years of experience working with people who have disabilities. Summer staff members go through an extensive application process, including background checks and training.

In order to provide quality care, the overall attendee to staff ratio is one-to-one. We are blessed to have an 85% return rate of campers from year to year.

Program:

Program Descriptions:

For campers whose diagnosis is a PHYSICAL disability and who are at or near age level academically:

- **Seekers:** Children who have completed kindergarten through 5th grade.
- Discoverers: Youth who are in middle or high school.
- Young Adult Bible Conference (YABC): Young adults who have the potential to be in college, careers and/or independent living situations. (ages 20s and 30s)

For campers whose diagnosis includes an INTELLECTUAL disability:

- Adventurers: Children who have completed kindergarten through age 12. (mild or moderate level)
- Voyagers: Youth and young adults ages 12-21. (mild or moderate level)
- **Explorers:** Youth and young adults ages 12+ who benefit from additional support for learning, communication and/or behavior. (all levels)
- Challengers: Adults ages 21+. (mild or moderate level)
- **Conquerors:** Young adults ages 21+ who are at or near their peer level socially and emotionally. (mild level)
