farmer in Ohio needed his pole barn moved. Not a little shed, like many of us have in our backyards. A large barn, probably the length of a basketball court. Typically, the answer might be to knock down the current barn and build another barn in the new location. Or maybe, for the frugal farmer, take it down piece by piece and rebuild it. Well, this farmer went about it in a different way. He had a couple hundred friends over who lined up around the walls of the barn. Together, they lifted, easily sharing the weight of

to people facing life's challenges, unencumbered by other's schedules, rental fees, accessibility issues and other changes out of our control. We have been eagerly anticipating having a permanent Ministry Center for years! We purchased the land, with your help, in 2016. We have designed the buildings, engineered the site and have been chipping away at the necessary approvals since 2017. We have relied on connections since Day One of this Ministry Center Project. We have depended on the people God has sent our way

the large pole barn. They walked it across the property and set it in its new location. The move took less than 10 minutes. The farmer used his connections to bring people together to do this seemingly impossible task.

H*VMI relies on connections in most all parts of our ministry. When is the last time you saw an H*VMI commercial? Yet, somehow, we never lack for people to serve at or participate in our programs. People talk and share, making connections with others in similar circumstances, sharing the help God provided them through H*VMI's outreach. Through the COVID related changes, we were able to hold Bible clubs and groups ONLY because of connections God made. For example, we are holding multiple smaller group clubs at brand new locations we had never used before. God used HIS people to provide those spaces for us.

H*VMI is in the midst of the largest project in our history, building a home of our own. A place where we can minister

to accomplish nearly every goal to this point. The Architect we used was a connection from an H*VMI missionary's church. The Engineer we hired was a connection from our Architect. Our Legal Counsel representing us through the bulk of these approvals has been on our board for many years. Our Project Manager connected with us when we looked into the possibility of using the church he attends for our training seminars. He is also the newest member of the H*VMI Board. Through the Zoning and Conditional Use approval processes, many local H*VMI supporters came to the meetings to share about H*VMI's impact on their family. We connected with some of these friends and they connected with others.

As we anticipate receiving our Land Development Plan approval and enter the next phase of the project, we need your connections: We will be excavating, building, framing, plumbing, wiring, dry walling, painting and many other things before our job is complete. If you own a business that does

these types of work, or if you know a business owner in one of these work fields who may be interested in helping, please make the CONNECTION. If your church group likes work projects—CONNECT with us! If you, yourself, know how to swing a hammer or handle a paint brush—CONNECT with us!

I look at this picture of the Amish men moving the barn (link to video https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qOpjHm6WzVg) and I think, how did that farmer get 250 people there to help him? Did he send out an email or post on social media? If you're familiar with the Amish, you'll know that's not likely. The need was likely shared at a gathering, church or when people saw each other during the week. A personal connection, lots of personal connections, brought about this amazing result. So if, as you read this, you think of people who you think could help H*VMI, I would challenge you to make a personal connection with them. Hold off on pressing "send" and go talk to them or pick up the phone and have a conversation about H*VMI. Share the impact H*VMI has had on your life and ask if they would be willing to connect with us, even just to explore possibilities.

As H*VMI has been moving through this project, I have always thought and said that money is going to be the least challenging aspect of this process. This has proven to be absolutely true! We have spent over four years designing, praying, engineering, praying, applying, praying, meeting, praying, negotiating, renegotiating and praying some more! We only spent about six months of that four-and-a-half-year period on fundraising. God provided the money to purchase the property outright! Then, He provided more funds to be able to pay for the professional work that has been done since then. And, we even have some startup money for when construction begins. Soon we will be launching Part Two of that fundraising effort to fund the construction of the H*VMI Ministry Center. We will humbly ask you to invest in the future ministry of H*VMI. I ask you, now, to be praying about how you might be able to partner with us. Could it be by making a connection? Could it be by giving a donation? Could it be both? Many hands made the moving of the farmer's barn an easy task. We are so grateful for the many connections we have had through the years, and we are excited to see how God will use His people to bring His Ministry Center project to completion.

CONNECTIONS PART 2

Your mother told you that you should always "behave" because, surely, at some point, you'll be bumping into someone, sometime, somewhere who knows someone who knows you! Huh? Did you follow that?

We are all CONNECTED. It's always a special occurrence, especially within the Christian community, when connections are made. I discovered an interesting connection when my husband, Tim, and I represented H*VMI on a team of Disability Ministry Trainers that Joni Eareckson Tada had organized for an outreach in Romania. As I was eating dinner at the table of my host family in Bucharest, I noticed the t-shirt the teenage son was wearing. It said, "Echelon Mall, Voorhees NJ." At that time in our life, we lived just down the road from that mall. I asked the teen where he got that shirt. He told me it was probably from a clothing bank at their church. It was a neat CONNECTION for me on my first trip out of the States, especially since I was a little homesick.

Discovering **CONNECTIONS** are usually a very pleasant surprise.

There are some neat **CONNECTIONS** in the H*VMI Ministry. We often find ourselves asking someone, "How did you hear about us?" Here are a few God ordained **H*VMI CONNECTIONS**.

A bereaved mom called our office needing to talk. "How did you hear about us?," we asked during that initial lengthy conversation. It seems that Dr. Kathy Koch, Founder and President of CELEBRATE KIDS, INC., recommended that this mom get in touch with us. About 30 years ago, our H*VMI staff had opportunity to sit under Dr. Koch's teaching. She remembered through all these years that we had a ministry to parents who lost a child and gave contact information to this hurting mom. She is now involved in one of our BASIS Support Groups.

Dr. Bud and Bonnie M. missionaries on furlough from Papua New Guinea, were attending a missions' conference in South Jersey. Tim and I were also participating in that conference. Dr. Bud wrote, "Once we heard of the work there at H*VMI from the Sheetzs, our hearts were touched." Following the conference, Dr. Bud and Bonnie returned to PNG to resume their own vital ministry, Dr. Bud using his medical skills and Bonnie developing a library ministry. They also began faithfully supporting H*VMI with their prayers and donations. Meanwhile, some years earlier, Evan H served as a counselor at Handi*Camp for several summers. Now married, he and his wife recently completed training to serve as missionaries in Papua New Guinea. We asked Evan if he knew of Dr. Bud. Evan wrote, "Yes, we know Dr. Bud. He has been a huge help walking us through all the medical details required of us and our son to move to PNG!"

Melissa worked at Handi*Camp for MANY years. Now, she's employed by Baron Insurance, Manheim PA. When her boss asked employees for suggestions for non-profits that the agency might contribute to, Melissa was happy to share about the ministry of H*VMI. We received a wonderful check from them toward the start-up costs of our recent "Lessons on the Lawn." Fast forward several months - we received a donation from a man we didn't know with "Baron Insurance" in the email address. What was the connection. we wondered?! We contacted Melissa. She said this man is actually her boss at Baron Insurance. Her boss told her that he and his wife had invited each of their kids to choose an organization to donate to this Christmas. Their ten year old son, Simon, remembering the gift sent previously to H*VMI, chose us! Simon loves camp and thought it would be really cool to give to Handi*Camp.

Focus on the Family is a global Christian ministry dedicated to helping families thrive. During H*VMI's early days, Tim Sheetz felt God's prompting to connect with FOF and offer H*VMI as a resource their ministry might use from time to time. Through the years, as people have contacted us from across the country, when asked the question, "How did you hear about us?," the response has often been, "Focus on the Family gave us your contact information." We've had opportunity to minister to many individuals and their families facing the challenges of disability or grief. In recent months, a heartbroken bereaved mom reached out to us from her home in the center of our country. It's been our privilege to send her resources and to keep in touch by phone and email.

We received a donation over Christmas from a new donor in CA. It was designated to Disability Ministries. The last name and that designation caused us to wonder, is there a connection to one of our Bible clubbers here in PA with that last name? We asked this clubber if she had any family in CA. She wrote back and said, "YES" and wondered why we asked. When we shared about the donation we received, she replied with the following: "That is my brother." She wrote further, "Since my parents and I do not really need anything for Christmas, my brother, instead of getting us something, is donating some money to some of the organizations that we want him to."

Leadership at a local church desiring to be "intentional stewards" with the resources God had entrusted to them. asked their staff for recommendations of ministries the church might honor with a donation. Several H*VMI missionaries attend this church, and several of their church members are served by H*VMI's camp and Bible club ministries, so H*VMI is known to the leadership there. H*VMI was one of the organizations selected. The pastor wrote us, "We believe in the work you are doing for the sake of the Gospel and trust this donation will help propel your ministry forward as you look to 2021. May the Lord continue to be honored and glorified through the vision of Handi*Vangelism."

Let me end where I began — with a Romanian CONNECTION. While I was in Romania, I kept a journal. I admit that I was brutally honest as I wrote. Although it was a wonderful ministry opportunity and I loved every part of that, it was a challenge for me to be so far from home, especially missing our two daughters. I was homesick. I was finding my way around in a country that was struggling to get back on its feet following the years of harsh rule by the communist dictator, Nicolae Ceausescu, who had been executed, along with his wife, a year before. I had no way of communicating with my husband who was ministering in another Romanian city while I was with the team in Bucharest. My writing reflected my struggles. When we got back to the States, we were able share our experiences at many churches, especially in the South Jersey area where we lived at the time. Many years later, H*VMI's office and many programs were established in PA. A couple and their son began getting involved in some of those programs. The son, who had autism, had been adopted from—Romania. His mother told me that, prior to going to Romania to see about adopting from

there, she had read my journal. Bleak and honest as it was, she said God used it to help prepare her and her husband for their own experiences in Romania. "How in the world did you get hold of that journal?" I asked. She said that she had obtained a copy from her dad who'd heard us give our Romanian report at his South Jersey church. Knowing his daughter and son-in-law were thinking of adopting a child from Romania, this dad asked me for the journal and passed it along. The family continues to be very involved in H*VMI today, including the husband now serving on our Board of Directors.

God is amazing in the way He makes CONNECTIONS, especially among His children. We thank Him for the CONNECTIONS and blessings He continues to pour out on this ministry through someone...who knows someone...who...

WHAT AM I GOING TO DO?

verwhelmed" most likely describes what all of us have been feeling over the past several months. Shutdowns, restrictions, fear, uncertainty. When it's hard to see the "light at the end of the tunnel," it raises some questions. "What am I going to do?" "Am I going to survive?" "Where and to whom can I go for help?"

King Jehoshaphat, in 2 Chronicles 20, probably had some similar questions. During his reign, he set out to do what was right in God's sight. Then, he made an unwise decision that was not God-ordained. He realized the error of his ways and resolved to obey the Lord going forward (2 Chronicles 19:1-11). Shortly after he made this commitment, an enormous test confronted Jehoshaphat. It was an absolute nightmare to him. Several armies united to make war with him!

2 Chronicles 20: 3 tells us that he was afraid. (Aren't we all, at times?!) However, Jehoshaphat had learned his lesson! So, this time, he "turned his attention to seek the Lord." He called for a national time of prayer and fasting. The people responded that they, too, wanted to seek the Lord.

Note some things Jehoshaphat did in his prayer. (20:6-12)

FIRST He looked away from the terror at the door

and turned his attention to the greatness and

power of God. (20:6)

SECOND He reviewed what God had done to bring

blessing in the past. (20:7-8)

THIRD He reassured himself that God cared for him,

would hear his plea and act. (20:9)

NEXT He humbled himself before God, admitting

that God had much greater wisdom than he, himself, had. (20:12) He said, "... we are powerless before this great multitude... coming against us; nor do we know what to

do, but our eyes are on You."



Following this prayer, in 2 Chronicles 20:14-19, we read that the Spirit of prophecy came upon Jahaziel, a Levite who was part of the congregation of pray-ers. Jahaziel encouraged the people to trust in God. He said, "Do not fear or be dismayed... for the battle is not yours but GOD'S." (20:15) And Jehoshaphat encouraged them further, "Put your trust in the LORD your God, and you will be established... and succeed." (20:20)

Dear Reader, perhaps you are feeling discouraged and overwhelmed by circumstances in your life – certainly, by things happening in the nation and the world! I encourage you to pray as Jehoshaphat prayed. The things that concern you may still be there; but, God is so much greater than those concerns. Tell Him, "God, I don't know what to do, but my eyes are on You." Then watch Him work, if not in the circumstance, most certainly in your own heart.
