




Joy and Grief

Choosing Joy

A story of dreams, hopes, loss, grief, restoration and joy By Chrystal Smallwood

There is joy after grief. Sometimes though you simply need to choose it.

One day I will meet my babies in heaven. I will hold them, and love

them, and tell them there wasn't a day that went by in which I did not think of them. I will tell them the stories of their sisters, and of camping at the farm in Vermont, and meeting Mickey Mouse and Cinderella.

One day I'll hold my babies. I will listen to them, look into their eyes as I run my fingers through their hair. I'll follow the shape of their eyebrows and cheekbones with my thumb as I hold their heads in my hand. I will count their fingers and toes and hang on every word they have to tell me.

I'll tell them of all the times I imagined them in my arms. But mostly, I'll hold them and love them and kiss them a million times.

I'll tell them how Jesus used them to teach me about Himself...Until that day comes, though, I know they are with One who is more loving than I, who created them exactly how He wanted them to be, and has a reason for every second they lived, no matter how

infinitely short I think that life was.

Many women have lost babies in some way or another.

Many husbands have wept alongside their wives as they grieved together. They've kissed infants goodbye one last time before placing

them in the ground. They've held their sixteenyear-old as they lay in the cancer ward, knowing there is nothing more to try. They've received the phone calls late at night, telling of the fatal accident. They have faced unspeakable loss.

We all share a similar grief. A parent isn't supposed to bury their child. My hope is that my story, our story, will comfort even just one with words of understanding.

Every parent who has ever buried a child... and managed to carry on understands that it takes sheer grit some days to do what needs to be done. It's pure courage to wake up the next morning. It's hard. It's really hard. Infinitely more difficult than anyone who has never experienced it can imagine.

I write our story because somewhere, sometime, there's going to be a little girl, who dreams big dreams, who thinks big thoughts and plans big plans, and one day those dreams and plans might

look very different that she imagined they would. That little girl might want to lock herself in her house and never come out. She might find herself angry at God, or the world, in a way she never thought she could be. She might find herself in a depression that she can't get herself out of. And she's probably wondering why it's all happening. She needs to know that she's done nothing wrong. That she's not a bad person. That God doesn't hate her. That she isn't being punished. That sin is the cause of death but that God can and will redeem her misery. She needs to know that, if she can hang on just a little bit longer, one day she will see that He has been faithful all along.

My prayer for this book, these words of our story, is that it will reach the hands and hearts of those in mourning with the Spirit of the Great Comforter, and in it you will find a heart who understands.

We chose life so many years ago. We continue to choose to live, continue living with everything we are and have. It has been a journey of love and laughter and joy and family and blessing.

It is hard to put into words the immense Lchanges that have occurred in my life since Rachel was born almost five years ago. I became aware of the "subculture" of special needs that exists in America today. Hospital stays, therapies, endless tests of endurance; but none of these prepared me for her Homegoing shortly before her fourth birthday.

As our family tried to put our lives back together again, I fluctuated between a faith in God that was a resting faith and a faith in a God because there was nowhere else to turn. If I could not trust that God was in control, who or what else was left? There was no hope away from that thread of thought.

How patient the Lord is with us! As the days went by, He slowly and carefully seeped into the cracks of our wounded hearts with a balm of peace. Smiles returned to our family. Rachel began to be remembered in life, not just in death.

Did our reality change? Did the circumstances go away in a miraculous cloud? No! What did change was our awareness that God really did care about us and could be trusted. I did not have to be a "Super Christian." I am not in charge of circumstances or of proving God's love. I simply must obey the commands He gives and allow His Spirit to change my heart and the hearts of those around me.


