There is a connection in the Bible with food and comfort.

During Holy Week Jesus shared the Passover Meal (the Last Supper) with His disciples. It was a time of intimate fellowship as Jesus tried to prepare His disciples for His coming death, but it also provided some assurance of a new covenant God was making with His people. Jesus passed the bread and the cup to symbolize this new covenant which would soon require His death. Knowing that Jesus wanted to spend time and fellowship with the disciples over a meal made it special. Perhaps we could call it "comfort food."

After the resurrection Jesus was walking along the Emmaus Road when he met up with two of His followers who did not recognize Him. In the course of the conversation He was invited by the followers to stop and eat with them and the Scripture tells us that it was "When Jesus was at the table with them, He took some bread, gave thanks, divided it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him." Luke 24:30-31.

A few days later Jesus was waiting on the shore when the disciples returned from fishing and "they saw a fire of hot coals. There were some fish on the fire, and there was bread. Then Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you just caught'...Jesus said, 'Come and eat."

When we take communion in our churches we are reminded that, as we partake of the bread and drink, Jesus is present with us in a very intimate and personal fellowship. Jesus reminded His disciples previously that

"If two or three people come together in My name I am there with them." Matthew 18:20. His presence is even more profound in the sacrament of communion.

It is typical today that after a funeral there is a meal to share with the grieving family and friends. We could call that "comfort food."

In our BASIS support groups we usually have food to share after the meeting, another example of "comfort food." It seems that providing food helps create an environment for fellowship.

The ministry of BASIS is founded largely on the Scripture, "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is the Father who is full of mercy and all comfort. He comforts us every time we have trouble, so when others have trouble, we can comfort them with the same comfort God gives us." 2 Corinthians 1:3-5.

So, not only is the food a comfort, but our presence with another grieving person is also a "comfort food" to them.

Jesus told His disciples, "My food is to do what the One who sent Me wants Me to do and to finish His work."

From this I can conclude that my nourishment comes not only from physical food shared in a fellowship setting, but it also comes by doing what God wants me to do. By comforting others with the same comfort God gives me I can provide "comfort food" for other hurting people. Now that sounds like a win-win situation. Just writing this makes me hungry.
