



Shelly's Cancer Journey- FINAL Almost

n August 17, 1969, only 10 minutes after mama arrived at the hospital, our third child (first daughter) Michelle (Shelley) joined us. From that moment our lives were impacted by the "spice" God brought into our world.

Daddy was a pastor and Mama a teacher, so our children grew up in a busy home. We relied on the Lord for our well-being and were keenly aware of *Proverbs* 22:6, "Train up a child in the way that he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it." This prompted us to use scripture in training our children.

Shelley matured, graduated from college, and worked at Dana Farber Cancer Institute in Boston. At age 31 she

married Stephen Patch. They had 2 boys and a girl. After being a homemaker for about 8 years, Shell again worked for D.F.C.I., in N.H.

In the spring of 2013 Shelley was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer at age 43.

That diagnosis changed our lives. Working at D.F.C.I. gave her a clear perspective of the situation, greater than even we, her family, could grasp. It also provided the opportunity to receive the finest care and treatment available.

Even though her situation was terminal, she committed to fulfill God's plan for her to the end. Shelley's target was clear! Her life verse, Jeremiah 29:11, prominently hung in her office for years. It was embroidered on her lunch bag and engraved on selected jewelry. She did all she could to convince those she loved that God had plans for them also. Knowing time was short freed her to use every opportunity to be a catalyst for Christ to all around her.

Shell and Stephen faced the looming reality by addressing short and long-term necessities. Shelley sought to address the future challenges of working full-time, managing a household, school and homework, after school childcare, etc. to prepare Stephen and the children for her absence.

She celebrated holidays, birthdays and seasonal delights fully, creating wonderful memories for each child. Multitasking was Shelley's life-style. She knew there wasn't enough time left to affect the lives she loved to the extent needed, so she focused on each one as opportunities arose.

In July 2014 Shell and Stephen hosted a "Celebration of Life" for family and close friends at the Cape Cod home of friends, with fun activities, a renewal of marriage vows (children as attendants), dinner, dancing, ending with an evening swim and fireworks. All were designed to assure her children of the love and bond within our family.

Mama accompanied Shelley on multiple trips into Boston for various medical procedures and admissions into the hospital. Friends, family, college mates, custodians, kitchen help, etc. visited Shell.

As parents, we were overwhelmed with sadness at Shelley's diagnosis, but faith in God dictates our

philosophy of life. This determined how we handled the entire situation. We prayed for healing but were reminded of Psalm 136:16 "All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be;" and Job 14:5. We still prayed, but for God's will.

We experienced the prayer support, encouragement, and accountability provided by the body of Christ as we dealt with the realization that we were losing our daughter, and the eventual loss. Our heartbreak peaked on March 18, 2015, when she went to be with the Lord.

The difficult thing about the aching void, beyond our grief as parents, was the impact of her death upon her

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husband, children, and siblings. Our main stability was the assurance that as bad as we felt losing our precious daughter, she was with God and we would see her again.

Hurry has no blessing at times like this. Moment by moment God works in and for us. It is this understanding and God's comfort that stabilizes us and brings joy out of it all. Daily we had to think of the truths left to us by Christ. It's what we call "balcony time"—it can be a great comfort to see things from a higher perspective. God is in charge and we wanted His help, encouragement and healing.

When we struggle with the loss, we climb step by step until we regain perspective. We leave the situation in His hands and instability diminishes. God filters feelings of loss and fills us with the pride of a remarkable daughter. As we envision the meeting with Shelley our spirits soar beyond the hurt and loss.

We're doing better each day!
