The HOPE of the GLORY of God"

I was 21 years old and 1400 miles from home on a summer adventure to work at Handi*Camp. Kathy was one of the women I met that summer. She was an avid fan of coffee and cheesecake before her body no longer allowed her the pleasure of eating food by mouth. Kathy was also not able to talk, instead spelling out her thoughts slowly...painstakingly...letter by letter with difficult-to-follow hands on an alphabet board.

I was afraid of Kathy at first; afraid of my ignorance of how to keep her physically comfortable; afraid of maneuvering her wheelchair; afraid of offending her by accident; afraid of revealing the potency of my fear. Every care-giving task was new to me. Every set of her instructions was delivered with uncomfortable slowness. It seemed such a gargantuan effort for her to send urgent messages (i.e. you dropped a bolt from my wheelchair into the trash can), that I could not imagine why she would waste costly communication opportunities on "frivolities" like asking friendly questions about my life or orchestrating practical jokes! During our week, I can count on one hand the specific things I remember Kathy spelling to me not related to the need of the moment. Each one was like a tiny window into a vibrant life I wish I could have known more fully, and I began to realize that communication is not just a sterile exchange of necessary information.

Kathy showed me: Even when communication is costly, it is worth spending to build relationship. Human "wants and needs" include food, water, rest, hygiene-but also shared laughter and shared ideas. Serving the Lord does not require taking action with a fully able body. Asked about employment, Kathy spelled without hesitation: "I serve the Lord," And she did. She served the Lord by praying, by trusting His Word, by acknowledging His



Lordship in her life. From my short observation, this was not an entirely peaceful or easy process, but she seemed to be at peace within it. Speech is not necessary to be fully known and fully loved by the God who grants, in His Mercy, that we might know Him in return. Kathy's story doesn't belong to me, but I wanted to share the ways our short interaction had a huge impact on my life. I know that the joys of heaven far surpass cheesecake, coffee, running, and even speech, and I rejoice that Kathy is living them now. "We rejoice in the hope of the glory of God." (Kathy went Home to be with the Lord in January of this year.)

- More than 50% of special needs parents reported that their child with a disability had been excluded at church.
- Almost 1/3 of special needs families said they had left at least one church because their child was not included or welcomed.
- Nearly 50% of special needs parents said they refrained from participating in a religious activity because their child was not included or welcomed.
- Among church-attending special needs families, 86.5% said that their church needs more education and training about disability.
